Dear Master Gardener Applicant:

Attached please find an application for the fall 2021 El Paso County Master Gardener program, a very successful **volunteer training program** that has been used in all fifty states and even some foreign countries. Although the program began in the state of Washington in 1972, Texas was not far behind, and El Paso, which has been training Master Gardeners since 1982, has the second oldest program in the state.

The Master Gardener program offers 12 weeks of intensive horticulture training on such topics as vegetable gardening, trees and pruning, xeriscaping, soils, fertilizers, plant pests and more. After successful completion of the course, **participants are required to volunteer time**, sharing with the community what they have learned through a number of educational related projects.

After your application has been received, you will be called for an interview with Master Gardeners. Although it is helpful for participants to have some basic knowledge about gardening and other plant-related topics, **the selection process will be based more on willingness to become an active volunteer** in an elite corps of El Paso County gardeners. If you are selected for the program, you will be given an intensive horticulture training that will serve as the foundation for the much broader knowledge that you will gain after having served as a volunteer (everyone who completes that program remarks that it is during the volunteer service of the program that they actually begin to retain the knowledge gained in the course).

After successful completion of the course, you will be asked to perform **at least 62 hours** of community service on approved projects during the following year. These volunteer hours will be served under the direction of the County Extension Agent and will involve answering questions from the public, working with other Master Gardeners in our research and demonstration gardens, designing and delivering gardening presentations, and various other fun projects throughout the year. Although only 62 hours of volunteer service are required to complete the program and become a certified Master Gardener, it is hoped that you will volunteer many more hours in your community. In order to retain your certification as a Master Gardener, you must perform volunteer hours and go through continuing education classes every year. Many opportunities exist for advance training courses, which are only taught to certify Master Gardeners.

The fee for the course is \$225.00. Each participant will be provided the Texas Master Gardener Handbook (a comprehensive horticultural text) as well as various other handouts on topics covered in each class.

Due to Covid-19, we will be hosting the trainings **Virtually** or **In-Person**. You will have the option to make a selection to the platform of your choose during the application process. Orientation will be held Thursday, August 26th with a four hour session. Classes will meet *virtually* or *in-person* every Thursday from 9a.m. until 4p.m. beginning September 2nd through November 4, 2021. The **in-person** classes will be held at the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service - Ascarate Annex, 301 Manny Martinez Sr. Drive, 2nd Floor, El Paso, TX 79905. **Virtual** classes will be via **ZOOM** platform. Please orient yourself with this program to see if it will work for you and your technical ability. All classes will be taught by professionals from the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension, as well as other horticulture experts.

Please do not send any money with your application. The course fee will be due at the time of registration, after an orientation to the program and it's requirements (August 26th).
